Railway and Forestry Museum



Just on the northeast edge of Prince George lays a big part of British Columbia's history. The Central British Columbia Railway and Forestry Museum located at 850 River Road has chronicled the major achievements these industries have had in the creation and stability of our corner of the world. The museum opened in July of 1986 to coincide with Expo '86 and the 150th anniversary of rail travel in Canada. It has recently been made mostly accessible so everyone can now enjoy the past. It is yours to explore and enjoy.

Visitors can tour through the train yard and see the facilities and transportation, fire protection, communication, forestry equipment from way, way back. History through pictures and animated displays welcome you as you enter; actual stations and outbuildings that serviced the national and provincial rail lines running through Prince George since the late 1800s are there in the rail yard. There is even the rail turntable that was used on the present Via Rail line (before it was Via Rail) to marvel at as well as the actual engines and railcars used through history. As well, a mini rail train ride around the park is available. The museum is open for summer escapes with self-guided tours from June to August (10am-5pm).

During the winter (September to May long weekend- 11am-4pm, Tuesday-Saturday) special events such as a Halloween and Christmas display and international struggles are displayed for your entertainment. The path around the outdoor part of the Museum is kept clear for self-guided tours. There is a modest admission charge that helps support the Museum and they also sell souvenirs, gifts, children's toys and literature in the main lobby.
