Cameron Street Bridge.

The spring and winter of 2006-2007 were hard on the Heritage trail north of Fort George park and along the Nechako River. Most of the trail beyond the Highway 16 underpass was flooded and parts had to be re-built thanks to a half-million dollar grant from the Provincial Emergency Program. A foot bridge was also washed out across a river drain leading into Cottonwood Island and a new part of the trail was constructed. The new trail entered the park at another point without crossing any of the river drains.

In 2009 the old wooden Cameron Street Bridge was replaced with a modern bridge crossing the Nechako River. Debates were held in City Hall to determine the fate of the old bridge, which is a Prince George Heritage item. Would it be used as a foot bridge across the Nechako? It was finally decided to construct a "scale" replica of the original Cameron Street Bridge and use it to replace the footbridge crossing into Cottonwood Island. A section of the original bridge is on display at the Rail and Forest museum along River Road.

In December 2010, the replica was completed but the remains of the old footbridge had to be removed from the banks of the drain. This proved to be quite a task as it was frozen into the mud. Early in January 2011, the replica was mounted in place and the trail was completed. According to the crane's scale the replica weighs 57.7 tons. The steel span that it replaced was 45 tons. This spring we can all "walk-n-roll" all the way from Carrie Jane Gray Park to the new Cameron Street Bridge.
